Alfred Niezychowski, 75, Served on German Raider

DETROIT, June 16 (AP) —
Alfred Niezychowski, who as a
Polish count served on the
German sea raider Kronprinz
Wilhelm in World War 1, died
Saturday at the age of 75.

Mr. Niezychowski was aboard
the armed merchantman in her
raids on the Atlantic Ocean
shortly after the start of the
war in 1914. The raider was
credited with sinking more
than a dozen ships and doing
\$25 million in damage to ships
and cargoes.

Hunted by the British Navy,
and with her crew ill from ber-
iberi, the Kronprinz Wilhelm
escaped to Virginia, where she
was interned by the United
States. The Count was made an
American prisoner of war when
this country entered the war in
1917. He was released in 1919.

Mr. Niezychowski renounced
his title, became an American
citizen and went into business.
He lived in Grosse Pointe for
many years.

He leaves his wife, the former
Nanine Ulman.
